It is inconceivable to us, as citizens of the United States, that we would ever have need to leave our country for political or economic reasons – or to make a better life for our family. Stop for a minute and think what it would be that would drive you to leave your home – knowing that life in a new country would almost certainly mean low wages, discrimination and possibly secrecy. These are not decisions that are easily made. Thinking this way, we can gain a clearer perspective on immigration issues and the people involved.
