If you would like to participate in this Mass and Anointing, please join us on Saturday, November 3<sup>rd</sup> at 11:00 a.m. in Church. Transportation will be provided for those who are unable to drive. 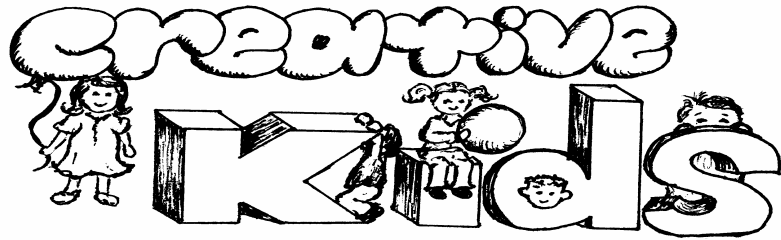

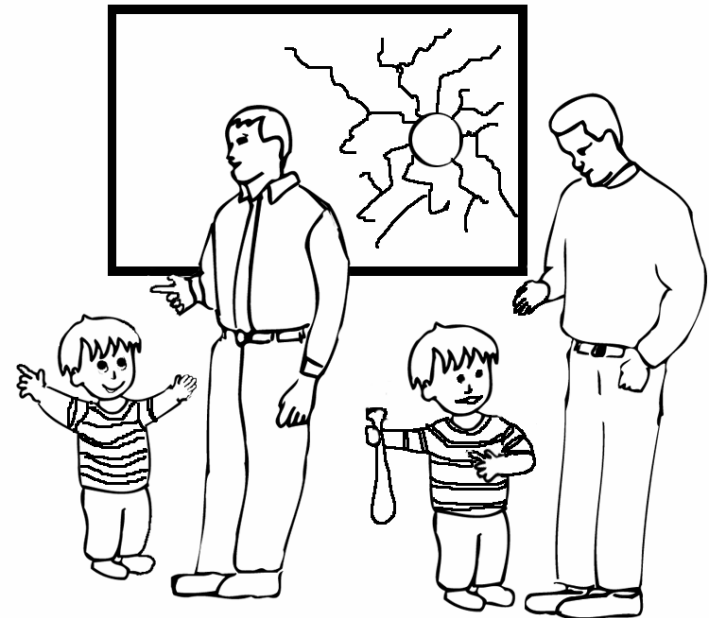

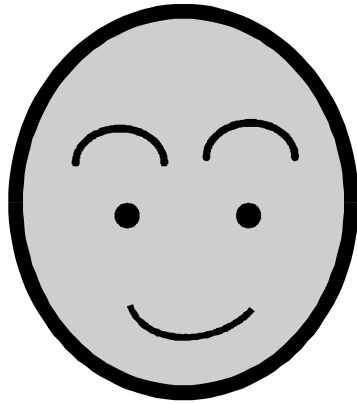
