Msgr. Voss received this letter this past week:

Dear Msgr. Voss,

As you know, we are relocating to Cape Coral, Florida on September 5, 2007.

Please accept our thanks for a wonderful ten years of attendance at St. Henry's. Yours is a special parish, with so much participation in every way. It has always impressed us, not only for its beauty, but for the many parishioners who help in so many areas of service.

We have appreciated you, as the pastor of this flock. It takes a leader, or perhaps I should say, a shepherd! Please thank your organist, choir director, choir, extraordinary ministers, altar boys and girls, lectors, song leaders, ushers, greeters, and any others who make the mass spiritual and meaningful. This is a family-oriented parish, and we will miss you.

Our new church in Florida is actually our "old" church, and can seat over 1,500 per mass. When we first moved there in 1982, the city held 30,000 people and swelled to 100,00 during season. Now, the population is over 100,000 and triples during the winter months! To get a parking spot, we have to be parked one-half hour in advance of any mass, of which there are two on Saturday and five on Sunday. As early birds, we like to attend the 7:30 a.m. on Sunday. We do have four permanent priests and several retired pastors who are more than happy to go south. Our wonderful St. Andrew Church has gone from its small town beginnings to the "big time", and there will be no going back. It is getting too close to the Mega-Church concept...
