Reconciliation

Parents begin preparation of Reconciliation for their children by attending parent meetings when their child is enrolled in Grade 1. Families then discern individually with the parish the age their child will receive the Sacrament.

The Illinois Bishop's guidelines on the Sacrament of Penance recommends that parents attend parent meeting when their child is in first grade to renew their understanding of the sacrament so that their families might participate at parish communal penance services prior to receiving First Reconciliation. Children might then become gradually familiar with the sacrament they would be preparing to receive. Parent and child are to discern when the child is ready to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The Illinois Bishops recommend that young children receive first reconciliation at a communal penance service that they have been familiar with attending.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation here at St. Cecilia

The Code of Canon Law A Text and Commentary Commissioned by the Canon Law Society of America comments under Canon 913 and 914 (Reception of Communion by Children) comments “Penance before First Communion” In the years following Vatican II there was rather widespread experimentation with the practice of delaying first penance until after first Communion, but the Apostolic See repeatedly ordered that the experiments be halted.” Nevertheless, canons 988 and 989, based on the discipline of the Council of Trent, require only those conscious of serious sin to confess before receiving Communion, and this also applies to children receiving first Communion. It does not seem that the intention of this canon is to subrogate this long-standing discipline but rather to suggest that the right of children to the sacrament of penance can be served best when pastors and catechists offer formation for penance appropriate to the level of the child making first Communion and provide the opportunity for the penance before first Communion for those children who need or desire the sacrament. Hence, children who do not approach the sacrament of penance should not be deprived of their right to make first Holy Communion.

Canon 988-1. A member of the Christian faithful is obliged to confess in kind and in number all serious sins committed after baptism and not yet directly remitted through the keys of the Church nor acknowledge in individual confession, of which one is conscious after diligent examination of conscience.

-2. It is to be recommended to the Christian faithful that venial sins also be confessed.

Canon 989-After having attained the age of discretion, each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year.

Commentary.

A careful distinction is drawn between the two paragraphs of canon 988. Any obligation to confess is limited to grave sins, in accord with paragraph one. In paragraph two there is a recommendation that venial sins (and, as is understood, grave sins that have already been directly remitted) be confessed, either in so-called confessions of devotion or in connection with the confession of a grave sin.

The forgiveness of venial sins may of course be sought and obtained in many non-sacramental ways, aside from the Eucharist or penance, through both individual and communal acts, none of which is excluded by the exhortation of the canon.

Also related to canon 988 is the reference in canon 914 to sacramental confession preceding the first Communion of children who have reached the use of reason. If the child is conscious of grave sin, he or she is bound by canon 988, paragraph 1 (and c.916); otherwise the reference in canon 915 may be understood in the light of canon 988 paragraph 2.

Canon 915-Those who are excommunicated or interdicted after the imposition or declaration of the penalty and others who obstinately persist in manifest grave sin are not to be admitted to Holy Communion.

Canon 916-A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to celebrate Mass or receive the Body of the Lord without prior sacramental confession unless a grave reason is present and there is no opportunity of confessing; in this case the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make and act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible.

The texts used in preparation for first communion do offer formation for penance and a non-sacramental ritual is celebrated in a rite of anointing based on RCIA. The canons do use the terms serious and grave which may previously have been termed mortal sin for which a person is obliged to receive the sacrament of Penance and recommended for venial sins or in some non-sacramental way. As for any adult who has committed grave or serious sin who is obliged to seek Sacrament of Penance, a seven year old would need to be conscious of serious/grave/mortal sin to be obliged to go to confession. Here at St. Cecilia we respect the right of every family to determine when their child is ready to prepare for Reconciliation. A preparation process for Reconciliation is provided for any age.
