FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Next weekend All Souls will hold registration for full time school for the 2006-2007 academic year. We continue our support of the Catholic elementary education of our children at Holy Trinity School.

As noted elsewhere in this bulletin it is important that any family interested in enrolling a child to do so in a timely fashion

Total costs (tuition and fees) for families with children attending Holy Trinity next year rise by \$150 per student. That means next year families:

with one child will pay \$3,310

with two children will pay \$4,160

with three children will pay \$5,010

with four children will pay \$5,860.

The funds raised by the families themselves cannot cover the total cost of running Holy Trinity School. All Souls Parish will also subsidize the school to the tune of \$1,300 per student.

It is within this framework that I continue to encourage you to contribute to our Parish ***Adopt-a-Student Fund***. This effort gives direct assistance to individual families under stress to meet their responsibilities in funding the Catholic education of their children at Holy Trinity. Donations of any size, over and above your regular donations in the collection basket, help these All Souls families in need.

As always I thank all the active parishioners of All Souls for their continued generous support of the parish and its efforts to provide quality Catholic elementary education to the next generation.

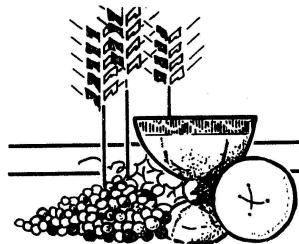

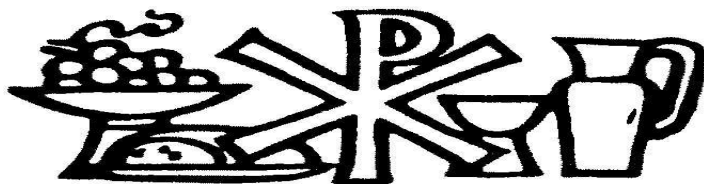

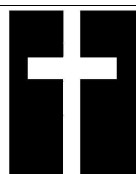
Holy Trinity School Registration of All Souls Students for the 2006-2007 School Year

A SAINT FOR THIS WEEK

She was first called Bakhita, meaning the “lucky one”, when she was born around 1868. She did not seem “lucky” when she was kidnapped from her home in the Dafur region of the Sudan by Arab slave traders at the age of nine. She eventually came into the possession of an Italian family and was taken back to Italy to care for their children.

While in Italy, she came into contact with the Canossian Sisters and was baptized. She was then called Josephine. Her awareness and appreciation of the God who loved her and brought her to freedom and faith in Christ grew steadily and her joy was to be with the sisters at their convent.

She took vows as a Canossian Daughter of Charity. She was then called Mother Moretta. (the dark one). For the next fifty years she lived as a model religious, prayerfully caring for her sisters and students. She cooked, sewed and answered the convent door with gentleness and compassion. Her reputation for charity and piety spread throughout the region of Venice. She was much loved, this Mother Josephine Bakhita, the Mother Moretta of the Canossian Sisters. She died in 1947. In the end she was fortunate and “lucky” to be so blessed by God.

Since she was canonized by Pope John Paul II in 2000, she is now called **Saint Josephine Bakhita**, and her memorial is kept on Wednesday of this week, February 8.

Violence and slavery continue in Saint Josephine Bakhita’s homeland of Sudan. Let us pray, as she did, for the conversion of those who do not know God and his loving will, as well as for an end to the evil and terror of slavery in Africa and throughout the world.

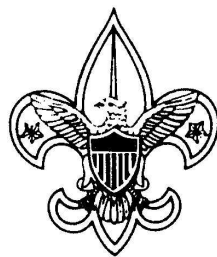

THE LIVING WORD

Hoping for Happiness

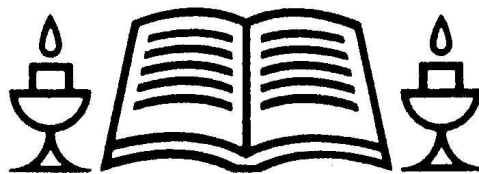
Why do we like movies with special effects? Maybe because they allow us to see things we would never see in real life. And that may be part of the attraction people felt for Jesus' healings: They had never seen anything like it. But more importantly, they felt hope.

The first reading from Job sounds very depressing. It is the lament of a man without hope. Perhaps there were times when we all felt that way, as Job says, "I shall not see happiness again." We can feel hopeless when problems are out of our control. And sickness, especially in Jesus' time, was a problem that people had no control over. So Jesus comes curing the sick and they began to hope in God's love for them. And in doing this, Jesus shows us how to have hope also.

No, it doesn't mean we have to heal people with miracles. Being hopeless sometimes happens when we are only concerned with what will make me happy. If our only reason for living is to make money and buy things, we will never truly be happy. Jesus shows us that caring for others is the way to happiness. When he came to Peter's house, he was probably tired from preaching and healing all day. Yet the first thing he does is to cure Peter's mother-in-law. And she seems to have learned from his example, because she begins to wait on the guests.

Sometimes we look for happiness in fame or recognition. When Jesus was becoming famous, he would go on to a different town and preach there. He could have stayed to bask in the glory, but he was not interested in that. And he did not claim to be indispensable. He knew that those who truly heard his message would continue his work when he left. He even took time away in deserted places to rest and pray.

So how do we find happiness? Do we try to serve others or need others to wait on us? Do we work long hours because we think no one can replace us, or that we'll be admired as a hard worker? Do we take time to enjoy our family and friends; do we spend time with Jesus in prayer? If hope means knowing that happiness is possible, let us find true happiness in serving the Lord.
