COLUMBARIUM—BELL TOWER

Where do we stand on the columbarium/bell tower? After this idea was brought forward with enthusiasm and we got permission from the Bishop to continue our investigation, other minds got turning on various options like columbarium alone, electronic bells in one of our existing towers, various placements, a cemetery, etc. The parishioners were asked one Sunday at the Masses if they were interested in having a columbarium, and the answer was "Yes!" The Parish Council wants an orderly process whereby everyone has a chance to express ideas. It also noticed that our Bishop Robert Baker said in his letter granting us permission to continue our investigation that whatever is brought forward needs to be in sink with our site plan. We realized that we do not have a site plan for the whole property so the Council is now working at obtaining such a plan from a professional site planner. That is where we are.

After we get a site plan, than a columbarium committee will be established to pursue the idea.

In the meantime, I would like to have a dinner meeting with all persons who have suggestions, ideas, and information on the topic to brainstorm and see what we unearth. Consensus building takes time, but it is the way to go. (continued on next column)
