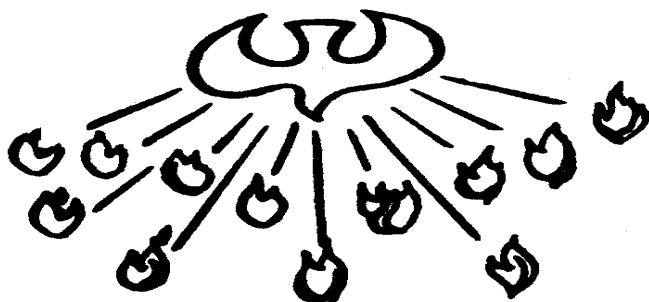
from the Pastors Pen

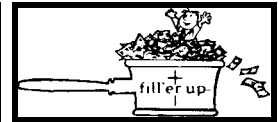
For all of us, may God's Holy Spirit bring us always closer together in Christ Jesus.

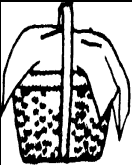
