from the Pastors Pen

The feasts of Trinity (last Sunday) and Body and Blood of Christ (today) are bright lights guiding our way back into the Ordinary Season. On Trinity Sunday our gaze is on the Godhead who creates (Father), redeems (Son) and sanctifies (Holy Spirit). Today's feast brings us before Jesus who unites and nourishes the Church on her pilgrim way to the Father.

The Eucharist is at the heart of the Church's being and mission. I remember how on the feast of Corpus Christi in our little town of Minster, Ohio, the people would go in procession through the streets with the Blessed Sacrament, stopping at three prepared sites for prayer and blessing. The procession would conclude in Church with Benediction.

Spirituality of the Blessed Sacrament has shifted today, the focus being more upon Christ present in the assembly than upon Christ's presence in the forms of bread and wine. Both forms of Christ's presence in the Eucharistic assembly are realized at Mass. Traditional rites of worship, such as genuflecting, kneeling, reverent silence in church, visits to the Blessed Sacrament, holy hours and Eucharistic devotions are ways to preserve our sense of awe and wonder at the presence of Christ in the Eucharist. At the same time we participate with others at Mass with singing, gestures, exchange of greeting, etc.

The feast of the Body and Blood of Christ is a special celebration for those who have adopted a Precious Blood spirituality. In that cup of covenant we find explanation for sin, unity and fidelity—both a personal and a communal way to God in Christ, who has redeemed us with his Precious blood. Happy feast!

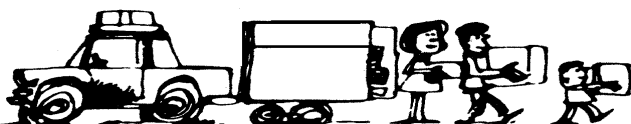
